Total cash donations in response to the last dues billing were \$510.00. In addition, many alumni gave of their time, talents, gasoline, etc. This dues billing was for two periods, and also included an appeal for funds for the Mother Rodarmel Memorial. Contributions designated for the Memorial amounted to \$80.00. At an April 6th meeting of the Board, the nature of the Memorial was finalized. Since that date was past press time, we will give you the results in the next newsletter. Speaking of results, the ballots you returned with your dues returned John Craft, Angie Kostas and Bill Montgomery to the Board. If you have any suggestions for this coming fall's Board election, please send them along with that dues check you are preparing to sign right now. Dues return now to the usual \$5.00; however, larger amounts will be gratefully accepted.

Due to the encouraging level of contributions, some repairs will be possible for the House. A new front door will be installed, and the sump pump will be put in proper order.

Treasurer Dave Estes, in addition to announcing the above repairs, noted that mortgage payments to Northwestern Mutual are completely up to date. The Chapter pays the Association rent of \$1760.00 per month, up from \$1560.00 per month last semester. This coming fall, the rent schedule will increase to \$2000.00. As you can see, therefore, our undergraduate Brothers are carrying their share.

Due to the fact that the response to the Investment Program outlined in the last issue was not large, we will be borrowing \$3000.00 this spring to carry us through the summer. The increased rent will enable us to retire this note, subsequently, on a short-term basis.
