"No Bad News!": Chi Phi Wins 2nd Place Trophy in I.U. Sing

There's "No Bad News!" at the Chi
Phi house as a result of their showing
in the I.U. Sing last month. Our Chi
Phi brothers, along with the dynamic,
gorgeous gals of Pi Beta Phi Sorority,
hauled away the 2½ foot high 2nd place
trophy in their division. The division
in which Chi Phi-Pi Beta Phi participated had 15 of the 28 acts which
entered the "Sing".

The theme of the Chi Phi-Pi Beta Phi mini-musical was "No Bad News!", which depicted New Yorkers living it up during the stock market crash. The act was presented for a sold-out house, comprised of some 4,100 persons.

The Chi Phi show was on the first

night of the Fri.-Sat. night "Sing".
Through the years it has been tradition that the Friday night presentations are rated lower than those on final night. However, it should be noted that the Chi Phi entry was rated 4th highest for its performance for both nights in all 3 divisions. In fact, the Chi Phi act was rated the highest for all divisions on Friday night - and no other Friday entry was close!

The Chi Phi song leaders of the "Sing" entry were JOB MORRIS '84. & DAN MONUTT '86. Bach year a few \$300 scholarships are awarded to song leaders who have demonstrated outstanding leadership skills & have maintained a healthy grade point average. Joe Morris & one of the Pi Beta Phi song leaders were awarded these scholarships. In fact, TOM DUFFY '84, who was the song leader of Chi Phi's 1982 I.U. Sing entry, received one of these scholarships in '82. This year Tom worked on the I.U. Sing production staff & was inelgible to assist the Chi Phi effort.

A sizeable number of Chi Phi parents & alumni attended the Chi Phi performance, in addition to the celebrations at the chapter house. An interesting sidelight is that one of PHIL MOS-BAUGH's '60 daughters currently is a Pi Beta Phi at I.U.

Chi Phi Scholarship

During the fall '82 semester at I.U., the Chi Phi chapter made another creditable showing in scholarship. The house average for the fall was 2.689. This was higher than I.U.'s all-mens average of 2.67. The Chi Phi house ranked 9th among the 33 fraternities & only 10 fraternities bettered the all-mens average.

SCOTT CURRY '83 recently received good news when he was accepted into the I.U. Medical School. Further, he has been named to Phi Beta Kappa for his academic achievements. Only 10% of the Phi Beta Kappas designated this year at I.U. are Greeks - and Scott is one of this minority.
