reams of what can be help give us the power to advance toward a greater and brighter future.

From the time the Chi Phi house was built at the corner of 17th Street and Jordan Avenue extended, we have dreamed of creating a bigger and grander addition to the existing structure. Ben Schmidt '01, Ryan Kanzleiter '03 and Jeremiah White '03 have taken this dream to heart and made an outstanding presentation to those alumni in attendance at Homecoming on October 21! They have been meeting with architects who have drawn initial renderings and created a three-dimensional model which they shared with us at an informal meeting. Our initial estimate is that the cost of adding approximately 7,500 square feet plus connecting to and renovating the existing space will cost between \$700,000 to \$900,000.

I understand that there have been false starts in the past, but there are several differences today that make this dream appear more possible than ever!

1) Strength of Chapter

Our undergraduate chapter is as strong as it has ever been in both quality and numbers of brothers. There are currently 50 brothers living in the house, approximately 30 undergraduates living elsewhere on campus, nine pledges in the fall class, and four more committed for the spring.

2) Positive Cash Flow

Our total operation has been showing positive cash flow for the last few years rather than struggling to break even as we have for most of our history.

3) Participation and Enthusiasm of Undergrads


The current interest and enthusiasm for pursuing this idea has come from the undergraduates rather being thrust upon them by the alumni.

4) Good Resources to Tap

We now have over 900 living alumni, and we are in a greater position collectively to share our resources of knowledge, experience and financial wealth than ever before.

Much has been done, but there is much more to do. We are moving into a phase wherein we will have a series of meetings with the architects involving a small group of alumni and undergraduates to fine-tune these plans and develop more specific cost estimates. So far our costs have been nominal, but this phase will require investing a few thousand dollars. We will keep you advised of our progress and invite your input and support.

Let's band together to make the dream a reality!

As the holiday season approaches, the Indiana Chi Phi Alumni Association and undergraduates wish you and your family all the best for the rest of the year and in 2001!




