# Capital Campaign, Chapter House Expansion Announced

At the 45th anniversary dinner, **Bob Szalay** '64 formally announced the Keeping the Promise Campaign to add a new wing onto the Iota Delta chapter house. Brother Szalay is the chair of the Keeping the Promise Campaign. He announced to the large crowd that over \$500,000 has already been pledged from a relatively small initial

group of alumni. The campaign stems from a 2001-2002 feasibility study and 2002-2003 IU campus market assessment by the alumni board and campaign steering committee. The expansion is the centerpiece of a new long-range plan developed in partnership with undergraduate officers. The campaign goal is \$1.2 million for construction, architectural and consultant fees, new furnishings, and necessary upgrades to the current chapter house — some of which have already been completed. Bob reported that gifts have ranged from about \$500 from undergraduates and newly graduated alumni to gifts in the high five figures from generous older alumni.

"We're convinced that the chapter house needs renovated, both to better market itself for today's young men and to better serve the needs of our alumni association," Brother Szalay said. Bob recently retired and recalled for the crowd how his undergraduate experiences

and relationships molded his thinking and character. "We're asking each Chi Phi to make a once-in-a-lifetime 'stretch' gift," he said. He stated that for some men that may be only \$1,000 while for other brothers that gift has already been much more.

After dinner, Alumni Association President Bill Brockmann '66 said, "Chi Phi has seen tremendous new energy in the past several years that needs supported by all alumni. We believe the chapter house expansion is vital to Chi Phi's survival and

long-term prosperity at Indiana University."

Brother Szalay stated that more information will be found in coming campaign mailings and contacts, but he invited all alumni to contact the board for a copy of the long-range plan for cost details and other new elements in the plan.

# Alumni With Josh Yarian '99

# An Army of One ... One lota Delta Brother

Recently the Iota Delta Update had a chance to speak with alumnus Josh Yarian '99 who has served in the U.S. Army in the continuing War on Terrorism.

# What did you take from your leadership experience as an undergraduate member?

My positions in the fraternity were rush chairman, vice president and president. What I learned is that if you are going to be in charge, you need to lead from the front, but not be afraid to ask for help and suggestions. It is a paradox that all leaders have to constantly balance. All too often I was operating with imperfect information and skewed viewpoints and if I would have taken a little more time to consider everyone's point of view, I could have been a much more effective leader.

# In your experience AFTER college, what have you learned to value?

One thing that is very important to me is integrity. The Hard Right over the Easy Wrong is something that everyone has struggled with. The key is to have the courage and commitment to take that hard road and stay your course because no one can take your integrity away from you.

#### What have been some of your assignments in the military?

I have been to Fort Knox, Ky.; Fort Benning, Ga.; and Fort Bragg, N.C. At Fort Knox, I was a rappel master and ropes instructor. I attended schools at Fort Benning for a little over six months before moving on to Fort Bragg where I was with Bravo Company, 2nd Battalion, 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82D Airborne Division. With 2/504, I was a platoon leader in charge of a 38-man platoon capable of deploying anywhere in the world within 18 hours of notification and performing a forced entry parachute insertion. I did that for about 10 months and then worked outside the battalion for a little before coming

back as a company executive officer where I was second in command of a 140man company.

# Your most recent assignment was to Afghanistan. What did you do?

We were conducting combat operations out of an airbase in southeastern Afghanistan. Most of our operations were called sensitive sight exploitations. We

would get signal hits from the bad guys using cell phones or intelligence from the local populace. From there we would go into a fairly quick planning cycle. I would usually leave a day or two earlier with a convoy of between 10 and 15 vehicles. My job was to cordon off the village about two minutes before the rest of my company landed in helicopters. It involved a lot of quick decisions and timing to ensure that my guys weren't landing in a hot area and when they did, that I could support them with the gun trucks. There were some pretty close calls during some of those missions. My time over there taught me a lot about what is important in life and made me realize that being a leader at any level is a huge responsibility.
