Construction on New Chapter House Wing Progressing Rapidly

After months of site preparation and extensive excavation, the masonry on Chi Phi's new chapter house wing was completed during late summer, and the walls began to rise in September. The structural steel is now onsite, and the HVAC and electrical contract has been awarded. The general contractor hopes to have the building protected and dry by mid-November.

These photos demonstrate the rapid recent progress following the resolution of many

engineering challenges. Prior issues of the *lota Delta Update* have reported the financing and construction stages to date.
