Behold, And Ponder Well

After nearly a half century, the Chi Phi chapter house wing nears completion

A 50-year Chi Phi dream is now close to reality: completion of a dignified new Iota Delta chapter house wing. With no significant further delays, the house wing should be finished during the coming winter. When completed, the wing will provide the marketability, curb appeal, and pride to match Chi Phi's prime location at 17th Street and North Jordan Avenue. Gone forever will be the "bunker" or "shoebox" look lamented by so many Brothers who have otherwise taken great pleasure in their Chi Phi bonds from Indiana University.

The initiative arose from a 2003 strategic planning process, when a newly seated Alumni Board held an unprecedented joint planning retreat with chapter officers. Using a consultant and the National office, Alumni and Actives developed a shared long-range plan. The plan has been a blueprint for efforts to develop a long-term fusion of Undergraduate and Alumni Brotherhood, a lifetime of friendship and professional networking. The plan has included a re-vamped rush program, frequent and jointly-held Board meetings, enhanced Alumni communication, and a constant process of re-assessment.



Chi Phi Chapter House Wing Nears Completion (Continued)

A key element was a move to upgrade the Chi Phi house and construct a new wing facing North Jordan Avenue. Other developmental concepts were analyzed, including the idea of moving Chi Phi to one of the empty IU Greek houses nearby. Based on many strategic factors, the Board decided in 2003 to proceed with major upgrades to the current chapter house, including the new wing.

That spring, a steering committee was formed under Brother Bob Szalay '64. The committee planned for both the 45th anniversary celebration and a follow-up capital drive to upgrade the chapter house. That "Keeping the Promise" campaign continues and will turn toward permanent capital funding when the new wing is done.

Formal groundbreaking took place in October of 2004 with IU and National Chi Phi representatives attending. Construction commenced in late 2005 after rounds of design revisions, permitting, and site plan review through both the University Trustees and the City of Bloomington.

Construction delays were reported in the spring 2006 *Update*. With major problems resolved, construction has moved forward this year, and interior finish work is now in process. Formal dedication is slated for Little 500 Saturday, April 21, 2007. Invitations to Alumni are expected. This project still needs your generous support, especially those of you long out of IU and now successful in your careers. There is no future or better time to show your support for *Keeping the Promise*.
